WAYS TO ADD MATHS INTO THE DAY

The following are some ideas for how you can add maths into the day:

Notice numbers – on buses, houses, shops etc.. Can you tell me what the number is? 1 more? 1 less? 10 more? Etc..

What shapes can you see? On a walk can you see any 2D or 3D shapes e.g. a ball is a sphere, a signpost may be a circle or a triangle, a can of beans is a cylinder. Who can see the most? What can you tell me about them?

Making patterns – can you make a pattern e.g. red, blue, green, red, blue etc or apple, pear, pear, apple, pear, pear.

What comes next?

Telling the time – a life skill!

Can you tell me the time now?

How many minutes to the next hour? What is the next hour?

Money – play shops – what coins can make this amount? Can you make it using 3 coins?
Not using a silver coin?

Get ready for the Swindon Library Summer Reading Challenge. This event launches on the 10th of July and ends on the 10th of September. More information is on its way on how children can register so watch this space. There will also be a Swindon Library Art Competition to enter which could keep the children busy over the holidays!

Booking School Meals
